## A roaring good time

The city got revved up Saturday by the 11th annual Classic Cars & Legendary Stars event. The popular event blends vintage cars and music to create a fun outdoor experience for the entire family. It is hosted by the Brampton Downtown Development Corporation (BDDC) and attracted hundreds of people from Brampton and surrounding areas.

"The event's popularity is partly because of the music and partly the classic cars," said Karen Campbell, BDDC president. "I find that the classic car component attracts a broad age group— kids, teenagers, families and older people— and seems to cross a spectrum of people."

The highlight of the three-day event was Saturday's Classic Car Parade and Show and Shine. This year, some 150 cars rolled through the downtown.

Organizers added several new features to the event this year, including a market place and kids zone in Ken Whillans Square with face painting, bouncy castle, crafts and games.

Part of the registration fee for the Beatles RockBand contest will go towards supporting the William Osler Health System Foundation.
